Protect Your Family

In order to prevent lead poisoning, you can utilize these FREE resources:

Child Blood Testing

- Newark Health Department: walk into 110 William Street or call 211 or (973) 733-5310
- CityLife Neighborhood Clinics (44 Jones St, Newark, by Shoprite) call (973) 878-9020

Water Testing & Lead Service Line Replacement

- PUR Water Filters and Replacement Cartridges are available at St. Peter's Rec Center (378 Lyons Ave), Boylan St Rec Center (916 South Orange Ave), and Vince Lombardi Center of Hope (201 Bloomfield Ave) **Tues-Fri 11am-7pm & Sat 9am-6pm**
- Pregnant women & families with children under six can pick up two cases of bottled water every two weeks at Newark Health Dept WIC Program (110 William St) **Mon-Fri 8:30am-4:30pm, Thurs open later until 6:30pm. 2nd & 4th Sat 9am-2pm**
- Call 211 or (973) 733-6303 to request a City water test for free

-  Don't run hot water through your filter
-  Flush water for five minutes first thing in the morning
-  Change filter cartridge every 2 or 3 months (red light)
-  Boiling water doesn't remove lead!
-  Use bottled or filtered water for drinking, cooking, washing produce, and making infant formula
